

Notice of Location of "Ruby" Mining Claim

Notice of Location

To whom it may concern:

Notice is hereby given, That I Daniel Spurgeon, a citizen of the United States of America, over the age of twenty-one years, having complied with the requirements of Chapter Sec. of Title Thirty-two of the Revised Statutes of the United States, and of all other mining laws thereof, and of the State of Washington and the local customs, laws, rules and regulations of miners, did on the thirty-first day of December A.D. 1898 locate, and by this notice do hereby locate a Lode Claim, known as the Ruby Lode or Mining Claim, said claim having been discovered the thirty-first day of December 1898, and do claim fifteen hundred linear feet on this lead-lode or vein bearing mineral in place, by six hundred feet in width, the same being three hundred feet on each side of the center thereof, together with all dips, spurs and angles, and all other veins or lodes, the top or apex of which lie within said boundaries situated in Skamania County, State of Washington. Said location being described and distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

This location notice is posted at discovery and the Ruby Lode Mining Claim hereby located is an extension of the Ida Martin Lode Mining claim and adjoins the Ida Martin Lode Mining Claim on the north. Said Ruby Mining Claim is situated on Copper Creek in Copper Creek Mining District, Skamania County, Wash., and extends fifteen hundred feet in a westerly direction from this discovery point.

I do intend to hold and work said claim in accordance with the local customs and rules of miners and the Mining Laws of the United States and of the State of Washington
