

Notice of Water Right

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned hereby claims the water now being, by right or flowing to the extent of Ten cubic feet per second of time, in the creek known as Mill Creek, in Twp 3 N. R 10 E. W. 46. Said Water is claimed as for irrigation, fluming lumber or wood, municipal or power uses, and may be used for any or all of these purposes at the following place to-wit: at or near the town of Warden, Washington. The water so claimed will be diverted from said stream near the line between sections 4 and 9 Twp 3 N. R 10 E. W. 46, at which said place a copy of this notice is posted on cedar tree. The means by which said water is to be converted to these uses is by ditch, flume or pipe to the place of intended use.
