

Copy of Will of Katharine Surber.

Know all men by these Presents, that I, Katharine Surber of Clarke County, Washington, of the age of 57 years, and being of sound and disposing mind and memory, and not acting under duress, undue, fraud or undue influence of any person whatever, do make publish and declare this my last will and testament in the manner following, that is to say:

First, all my debts and reasonable funeral expenses shall be paid out of my estate as soon after my decease as my Executor may find it convenient.

Second, my children hereinafter named I command to the kindest consideration and remembrance of their father. They are named as follows: Jacob Surber, aged 25 years; Lena, aged 24 years; Bertha aged 22 years; Willie aged 18 years; Charlie aged 16 years and Anna aged 12 years.

Third, I further give and bequeath to each of the daughters Lena and Bertha above named the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars provided their father be dead at the time of my death, and not otherwise. Fourth, I give and bequeath to my husband the father of above named children, all the real and personal property of which I die seized or possessed.

Fifth, I hereby nominate and appoint my said husband to be the Executor of this will and guardian of my minor children and no bonds shall be required of him in either capacity.

Sixth, In the event of my death of my said husband & against so such Executor John Klein, of Vancouver, and no bonds shall be required of him.

Lastly, It is my will that my estate be managed and settled by my Executor as his own manner and time as he may deem best and it shall not be necessary to take out letters of administration or of administration in my estate and after the probate of this will no further proceedings in the Court shall be required.
