Power of Attorney.

I, the undersigned, do hereby declare, that whereas, by an Act of
Congress, approved June 4th, 1897, (30 Stat. 30), it is provided: "That the
cases which a tract of land covered by an unperfected bona fide claim or by a
patent is included within the limits of a Public Forest Reservation,
the _____ owner thereof may, if he desires to do so, relinquish
the tract to the Government, and may select in lieu thereof a tract of
vacant land open to settlement, etc."

Now whereas, on the twenty-third day of December, 1904, William T. Baker
of the city and County of Marquette and State of Michigan was the
owner of Northwest quarter ($N.W.\frac{1}{4}$) of the Northwest quarter ($N.W.\frac{1}{4}$)
of section twenty-nine ($\frac{1}{4}$) Township Twenty-three (23) North of

Range Seven (7) East of the Gila and Salt River meridians containing forty acres more or less, which said tract, prior to said date, has been included in the San Francisco Mountains Forest Reservation.

And whereas, on said last named day, the said William F. Baker, surrendered the said land to the United States by deed of conveyance duly executed by which he became entitled to select other lands of equal acreage in lieu thereof.

Now therefore, the said William F. Baker and Daniels Baker, his wife, have made, constituted and appointed, and by these presents to make a written and appoint O. P. M. Jamison, of Portland, County Multnomah, their true and lawful attorney for them and in their name, place and stead, to enter into and take possession of each and every tract and of public land in any State or Territory of the United States that has been, or may be hereafter selected by said William F. Baker in lieu of the land described above, and surrendered to the United States as aforesaid, or any part thereof. The said attorney in fact is also hereby authorized and empowered to grant, bargain, sell and convey by good and sufficient deed, all the right, title, estate and interest that they now hold, own or possess, and also all of the right, title, estate and interest they may hereafter acquire of, in and to the land, or in part thereof, for such sum and price as may be deemed proper and for all and any of the powers and purposes forewarded for them and in their name, to make, execute, acknowledge and deliver all necessary deeds, assignments, assignments or other instruments of whatsoever kind or nature.

Giving and granting unto the said attorney full power and authority to do and perform all and every act and thing whatsoever requisite and necessary to be done, in and about the premises as fully to all intents and purpose as they might or could do if personally present, with full power of substitution and re-vocation, hereby ratifying and confirming all that their said attorney or his substitute shall lawfully do or cause to be done by virtue thereof.

For value received, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, this power of attorney is hereby made and declared to be irrevocable by them or otherwise.
