To all whom it may concern: Notice is hereby given that Edwin Learned and Mary Learned, the defendants above named have commenced an action against J. M. Dunn, the above named defendant, in the Superior Court of Skamania County, Washington, and have filed their complaint with the clerk of said court; the names of the parties to said suit are the plaintiffs and defendants above named; that the object of the action is to enforce specific performance of an oral contract to convey an undivided one half interest in the following described real property situated in Skamania County, Washington and which is described thereby, to-wit: The west half of the Southeast quarter and the east half of the Southwest quarter of Section 35, Township 3 North of Range 7, Land Will. Mcl. in Skamania County, Washington; also an undivided three-fourths interest in all that certain parcel or tract of land situated in Skamania County, Washington, bounded and described as follows: Beginning on the bank of the Columbia River, at the Southeast corner of the said Washington Southeast Land Claim; thence North about 9 chains to the Northwest corner of said claim; thence West to the North boundary of said claim about 76 chains, to the Northwest corner of said claim; thence South to the West boundary of said claim 9.09; thence on a straight line to a point on the bank of the Columbia River marked "D. A. & F. G.
