

Water Right

 County of Skamania } ss. To all whom these Presents may concern:
 Be it known that I, the undersigned claim the water flowing in the stream known as Cold Water and having its source & head of Shovel Lake in said County and State, do hereby publish and declare, as a legal notice to all the world that I have a legal right to ~~use~~ use, possess and control of - I claim the waters to the extent per second of time 20000, twenty thousand cubic inches of the waters of Cold Water Stream in said County and State, for irrigating and other purposes. That the special purpose for which said water is intended to be used, and the place of intended use is for mining, milling and manufacturing purposes, i. e. by electricity or otherwise and the place of intended use near the line of Skamania & Lewis & Clark Counties, location not exactly known. That I have appropriated said water out of and intend divert it from said Cold Water by means of a flume, pipe or ditch line & postrock which said diversion is about 48 inches by 48 inches in size and carries or conducts - inches of water from said stream said flume line taps and diverts the water from said stream at a point upon its right bank about eight miles above the mouth of said stream by a concrete box of suitable proportion or otherwise coming at a suitable grade about 4 miles through unincorporated government land, in Township 9 N. R. 5. E. Skamania Co. State of Washington St. Helens Mining District (unorganized) thence running, or to run to and upon said described land.

That I appropriated said water on the second day of June A. D. 1906 by means of said water given by the laws and Statutes of the State of Washington. That the name of the appropriator of said water C. C. Brown.

That I also hereby claim said ditch and the right of way therefor, and for said water by it conveyed, or to be conveyed from said point of appropriation to said land or point of final discharge, and also the right of location.

That I also claim the right to keep in repair and to enlarge said course of water appropriation at any time and the right to dispose of the said right, water, ditch or said appurtenances in part or whole, at any time.

Claiming the same all and singular under any and all laws, National and State, and the rulings and decisions thereunder, the matters of water rights. Together with, all and singular the hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging or appertaining as to accrue to the same.
