The source of the water for the Lake is the small Mountain streams from the range of mountains bordering the Lake on the East, North and West. The applicant has filed no other declaratory statement under this act, except the one mentioned for purpose here, and I further certify that this is the true full purpose and intention of this applicant to use said Lake for the purpose herein set forth and maintain the same in accordance with the provisions of said act of Congress, and such regulations as are or may be prescribed thereunder.
