Notice is hereby given that Phillip A. Ferris of Skamania County, State of Washington claims a lien upon certain logs which were cut in Skamania County, State of Washington and have heretofore been delivered to one certain Smith, for labor performed upon and assistance rendered in logging of said logs; that the name of the owner or reputed owner is Wentworth Wilbur d.b.a. Wilbur Contracting Company, who employed said Phillip A. Ferris to perform such labor and render such assistance upon the following terms and conditions, to-wit:

That said labor consisted of bucking and driving caterpillar, for which the said Wentworth Wilbur agreed to pay the said Phillip A. Ferris the sum of Four Dollars (\$4.00) a day up to and including March 14, 1941 and Five Dollars (\$5.00) a day from and including March 15, 1941; that said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with upon the part of the said Phillip A. Ferris, who performed labor/and assisted in logging said logs between the 19th day of February, 1941 and the 18th day of April, 1941; and the ren-

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dition of said service was closed on the 18th day of April, 1941, and thirty (30) days have not elapsed since that time; that the amount of claimants demand for said service is the sum of Two Hundred Seven Dollars (\$207.00); that no part thereof has been paid except the sum of One Hundred Twenty Two (\$122.00), and that there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon after deducting all just credits and off sets the sum of Eighty Five Dollars (\$85.00), in which amount he claims a lien upon said logs and/or lumber cut therefrom and/or the purchase price thereof remaining due and unpaid from the said Smith.

Notice is hereby given, that on 14th day of March, 1941, the above named claimant, through the State Division of Forestry, commenced to perform labor upon and furnish materials in fighting a certain fire upon the following described property, to-wit:

Tax Lot 3 in NW 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 22, Township 2 North, Range 6 East, Skamania County (containing 16 acres),

of which property the owner or reputed owner is William J. Vincent.

The performance of such labor and the furnishing of such materials was done under and pursuant to the Forest Protection Laws of the State of Washington, and more particularly to Section 5806 of Remington's Revised Statutes of the State of Washington.

The performance of the labor and the furnishing of the materials ceased on the 20th day of March, 1941; said labor performed was of the value of \$78.30 and not more than ninety days have elapsed since said named date, for which labor the claimant claims a lien upon the property hereinbefore described for the said sum of seventy-eight dollars and thirty cents (\$78.30).
