Power of Attorney.

Know all men by these Presents: That Whereas, by an act of Congress, approved June 4, 1897 (30 Stat. 367), it is provided:

"That in cases in which a tract covered by a patent is included within the limits of a public forest reservation, the owner thereof may, if he desires to do so, relinquish the tract to the Government, and may select in lieu thereof a tract of vacant land open to settlement," etc. And Whereas on the 11th day of June, 1906, the Aztec Land and Cattle Company, Limited, a Corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of New York, was the owner of the following described land:

The South-East quarter of the South-East quarter of Section thirty-five (35) in Township eighteen (18) North, Range eleven (11) East, Gila and Salt River Meridian, in the County of Coconino, Territory of Arizona, which said tract prior to said date, had been included within the limits of the San Francisco Mountains Forest Reserve. And, Whereas, on the said last named day the said Company surrendered the said lands to the United States by deed of conveyance duly executed, by which it became entitled to select other lands of equal acreage in lieu thereof;
