 County of Stevens <sup>3<sup>rd</sup>. Know all men by these presents. (1) That we, S. S. Hayes and W. O. Hadley claim the water flowing to the extent of one cubic foot of water per second of time or any multiple of said amount or fractional part thereof which may be flowing at any time of the year from a small creek running in a southerly direction along the east base side of Bear Mountain and emptying into the Columbia River. The point of diversion to be thirteen chains (13.00) West in line line from 1<sup>st</sup> Section corner to North boundary of Section 36 T. 3 N.R. 8 E. W.M. in Stevens Co. State of Washington. (2) Said water to be appropriated for purposes of irrigation household, stock and supply for fish pond to be used on lands owned by S.S. Hayes and W.O. Hadley. (3) The means of diversion to be flumes, pipes and ditches by us.</sup>
