Know all men by these presents that we the undersigned Ole Thompson and his wife, Christine, and Andrew Bergquist, all of Home Valley, Skamania Co. State of Wash. do hereby mutual consent agree and permit to sell for the consideration of one dollar of lawful money of the U. Notice of Appropriation of Water.

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned, R. S. Cameron & Mrs R. S. Cameron of White Salmon, Wash. claim the water from this stream, known as the Big Spring, all of the water running or flowing in said stream to the extent of eighteen Mexican inches cubic feet of water per $\frac{1}{2}$ second of time. The purpose for which said water is appropriated is for household, domestic and irrigation purposes and the place of intended use is the farms or premises of the above mentioned appropriation which premises are particularly described as follows: The N $\frac{1}{2}$ of N. E. $\frac{1}{4}$, the S. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of N. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 10. & N $\frac{1}{2}$ of N. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 11. all in Township 3 N. R. 10. E. W. M. of section. --- in Township 3 north of range 10 east of the Willamette Meridian.

The means by which it is intended to divert the water from said stream is a head gate which shall be located at the point on the stream about midway between North & south line of the North E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of N. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 10. Township 3 N. R. 10. E. W. M. from which the corner of section 10 in Township 3 north of range 10. East of the Willamette Meridian bears in a North easterly direction about 100 rods distant and said water shall be conveyed from said head gate by means of a flume & pipe of sufficient size and carrying capacity to carry said water
