NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Gerald R. Slayter of Cougar,
Cowlitz County, Washington, claims a lien upon a quantity of logs, being
about 125,000 board feet in quantity, which were cut or manufactured
in or near Section 13, Township 5 North, Range 1 East of the Willamette
Meridian, Skamania County, Washington, and are marked thus: H T
and are now located where felled and trucked as aforesaid and at the
Hegewald Timber Company storage yard in Stevenson, Skamania County,
Washington, for labor performed upon and assistance rendered in the
felling and bucking of said timber and logs; that the name of the
owner or reputed owner of said timber and logs is John Brunstrom, Jr.,
and Hegewald Timber Co.; that John Brunstrom, Jr., a contract logger,
for Hegewald Timber Co. employed Gerald R. Slayter to perform such
work and render such assistance upon the following conditions, to-wit:

The said John Brunstrom, Jr., agreed to pay the said Gerald R.
Slayter the sum of \$50.00 per day for labor and assistance in felling
and bucking said timber and logs; that said contract has been fully
and faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of
Gerald R. Slayter, who performed labor upon and assisted in the felling
and bucking of logs and timber for said John Brunstrom, Jr., for a
period of approximately seven months; that said labor and assistance
were so performed and rendered upon said logs and timber between
March 1, 1967, and August 15, 1967; that the rendition of said service
was closed upon August 15, 1967, and thirty days have not elapsed
since that time; that the amount of claimant's demand is \$1,226.00
and that no part thereof has been paid; that after deducting \$126.00
just credits and set offs, there is now due and remaining unpaid




Colonel John W. Dickey, Paymaster General, should be called on first upon all
