Notice is hereby given that the undersigned claim the water & the extent of Five 57 cubic feet per second of time, flowing through the creek described as follows, to-wit: Said creek has a Northwesterly course across lots three (3) and four (4) in Section eighteen (18) Township and Lots one (1) and two (2) in Section Nineteen (19) in Township Three (3) North of Range Ten (10) back of the Willamette Mountain. The water is to be taken from said creek by means of a flume at a point about four hundred (400) feet North of the North line of Lot One (1) in Section Nineteen (19) aforesaid and to be used for irrigation and domestic purposes upon the following described property to-wit: Lots one (1) and two (2) and bush half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of the Northwesterly corner of Section eighteen (18) in Township Three (3) North of Range ten (10) back of the Willamette Mountain.

This notice is posted on or about the intended point of diversion on the Pather Creek West side of aforesaid Pather Creek 4500 feet more or less above the old loggy dam and bridge posted on a large cedar tree west bank of Pather Creek, blazed on 4 sides.
