Third - All and singular the premises and property real, personal and mixed, rights, privileges, immunities and franchises formerly owned by the Washington and Idaho Railroad Company and conveyed to the parties of the first part by the said deed of Wellington Clark Special Master, in the said suit of the Bay State Trust Company against the Washington and Idaho Railroad Company and others and described as follows namely:

All and singular the premises and property, real, personal, and mixed, rights, privileges, immunities and franchises, particularly described in the Indenture of Trust or Mortgage made by the Washington and Idaho Railroad Company to the Bay State Trust Company, dated September second 1889, then owned or intended to be acquired by the said Washington and Idaho Railroad Company, to wit:-

All that line of railway and line of telegraph in the State of Washington, commencing at the Town of Farmington in said State and extending thence in a generally northerly direction to a point at or near the Town of Spokane Falls in said State; and all that line of railway and line of telegraph in the same State, commencing at a point on the line of railway hereinbefore described, near the forks of Hangman Creek in said State and extending thence in a generally northeasterly direction across the Coeur d'Alene Indian Reservation to a point near the mouth of St Joseph River on Coeur d'Alene Lake; thence in a northerly direction along the east side of Coeur d'Alene Lake to the Coeur d'Alene River thence in a generally easterly direction to the Coeur d'Alene Mission; thence in a southeasterly direction by the Valley of the South Fork of the Coeur d'Alene River to Wardner, in the State of Idaho.
