

thence (without variation) South 35° West 750 feet to a post; thence North 55° West 3000 feet to a post; thence North 55° East 750 feet to a post on the center of the tunnel line; thence North 55° East 750 feet to a post; thence South 55° East 3000 feet to a post; and thence South 55° West 750 feet to the point of beginning; the center line of said tunnel bearing North 55° West from the face thereof for 3000 feet to a post, which center line of said tunnel is marked on the ground by stakes at intervals of about two hundred (200) feet. From the face of tunnel a dead leaning tree bears North 68° East 200 feet distant; a dead snag twisted wood bears South 8° East 130 feet distant.

Notice of Location of this claim was filed and registered in the office of the Auditor of Lewis County, Washington, May 27th, 1895, in Volume 4 of Mining Records, on page 25.

2. Samson South Discovery Claim located and discovered May 3rd, 1895 by Mrs Mary E O'Connor described and bounded by a line beginning at a post at the face of the Samson tunnel claim as the point of discovery, and bordering on the South line of said tunnel claim, and running thence (without variation) South 35° West 300 feet; thence South 55° East 1500 feet; thence North 35° East 600 feet; thence North 55° West 1500 feet; and thence South 35° West 300 feet to the point of beginning.

The point of discovery of this claim is the same as the point of beginning of the boundaries of the Samson tunnel claim as hereinbelow stated.

Notice of location of this claim was filed and registered in said Auditor's office May 27, 1895, in Vol. 4 of Mining Records, on page 26.

3. Samson South Extension Claim located and discovered May 3rd, 1895 by John Wold and described and bounded as follows:-
