9. The West-Discovery Claim of the West-Samson Lode discovered and located June 17, 1895 by A. Wood, and described and bounded as follows:

Beginning at the point of discovery below a high cliff west of the Samson Excelsior Lode, discovered at a burnt stump of a fir tree about thirty feet high, on the South slope of Star Mountain about one mile Northwest of Camp Samson; running thence 300 feet North and thence 1500 feet East; thence 600 feet South; thence 1500 East and thence 300 feet North to the place of beginning.

10. The East-Discovery Claim of the West-Samson Lode discovered and located June 17, 1895 by A. Ludloff and described and bounded as follows:-
