Beginning at the same place of discovery as that of the claim last above described, and running thence 300 feet North 45° East-; thence 1500 feet South 45° East-; thence 600 feet South 45° West-; thence 1500 feet North 45° West-; and thence 300 feet North 45° East to the place of beginning.

15. The Northwest Discovery Claim of the Johnson Junior Lode, discovered and located June 17, 1895 by J. Ludloff, and described and bounded as follows:

Beginning at the place of discovery in Johnson gulch upper Taotle River basin, about 50 paces South of Northeast-corner of the North Johnson claim, near the eastern boundary line on the eastern slope of the Creek bed about 50 paces South, 10° West from location Notice on an old fir tree; thence North 83° East- 300 feet; thence North 7° West- 1500 feet; thence South 83° West- 600 feet; thence South 70° East- 1500 feet; and thence North 83° East- to the place of beginning.
