19. The Southwest Discovery Claim of the Samson Primus Lode. Discovered May 3rd, 1895 and located June 24, 1895 by F. Ludloff, and described and bounded as follows:

Beginning at the place of discovery in Creek Bed in the upper North Tooth Valley, Samson Basin, Samson Gulch, about 500 feet higher up into the gulch than the entrance of the Samson Tunnel, hereinafter described. Below a cascade where the outlet of the Creek runs directly over the out-crop of the vein, and running thence 500 feet North 45° West: thence 1500 feet South 45° West: thence 600 feet South 45° East: thence 1500 feet North 45° East: and thence 300 feet North 45° West to the place of beginning.
