

Alstia Lode Discovery, but about 800 feet further and 200 feet higher in the gulch, said place of discovery being marked by a post directly on the vein; and running thence 300 feet North 20° East; thence 1500 feet North 70° West; thence 600 feet South 20° East; thence 1000 feet South 70° East; and thence 300 feet North 20° East to the place of beginning. Notice of location of this claim was filed and registered in said Auditor's office July 3, 1895, in Volume 4 of Mining Records, Page 57.

27. The Southwest-discovery Claim of the George Be Lode in Skamania County, Washington, discovered and located June 22, 1895 by Paul S. Reinck, and described and bounded as follows:

Beginning at the place of discovery in Creek bed in German gulch, upper North Touth valley, South slope of Star Mountain, the same as Alstia lode claim, above the forks of the Creek on the western slope of the main creek; and running thence 500 feet South 70° East; thence 1500 feet South 20° West; thence 600 feet North 70° West; thence 1500 feet North 20° East; thence 300 feet South 70° East to the place of beginning. Notice of location of this claim was filed and registered in said Auditor's office July 3, 1895, in Vol. 4 of Mining Records, at page 43.

28. The Northwest-Discovery Claim of the Madison Lode in Skamania County, State of Washington, discovered and located June 10, 1895 by Paul S. Reinck and described as follows:-

Beginning at the place of discovery in the bed of divide creek, one-half way between the Gladys and Thine lodes, Samson basin, upper North Touth Valley, North of Camp Samson, and running thence 300 feet North 45° East; thence 1500 feet North 45° West; thence 600 feet South 45° West; thence 1500 feet South 45° East; and thence 300 feet North 45° East to the place of beginning.
