Beginning at the place of discovery in the bed of Star Creek, the Northwestern tributary of divide Creek which meets this latter creek between the Gladys lode in Samson Basin, upper North Toutle Valley, North of Camp Samson, and running thence 200 feet North 57° West; thence 1500 feet North 35° East; thence 600 feet South 57° East; thence 1500 feet South 35° West; and thence 300 feet North 57° West to the place of beginning. 30. The Northwest-Discovery Claim of the Mt. Hood Lode in Skamania County, Washington, discovered and located July 9, 1895, by J. Hudlog and H. Wood and described and bounded as follows:-

Beginning at the place of discovery on the west fork of North Toutle River, upper and prominent falls. Second basin, about one mile above the Chicago Discovery Claim; and running thence 300 feet North 45° East; thence 1500 feet North 45° West; thence 600 feet South 45° West; thence 1500 feet South 45° East; and thence 300 feet North 45° East to the place of beginning.
