

Washington. Discovered and located July 17, 1895 by J. Fudloff, and described and bounded as follows:-

Beginning at the place of discovery on Grizzly Creek, upper North Fork Toutle valley, about 500 feet above first William Lode discovery and East of Grizzly gulch: and running thence 300 feet South 85° West: thence 1500 feet North 5° East: thence 600 feet North 85° East: thence 1500 feet South 5° East: thence 300 feet South 85° West to the place of beginning.

32. The Southeast Discovery Claim of the Mt Adams Primus Lode, in Skamania County, State of Washington discovered and located July 17, 1895, by W. Chold and described and bounded as follows:-

Beginning at the same place of discovery as the claim last above described: and running thence 300 feet South 85° West: thence 1500 feet South 5° East: thence 600 feet North 85° East: thence 1000 feet North 5° West: and thence 300 feet to the place of beginning. Notice of location of this claim was filed and recorded in said Auditor's office December 31, 1895, in Volume 4 of Mining Records, on page 285.

33. The Northwest Discovery Claim of the Mt Adams Secundus Lode in Skamania County, State of Washington discovered and located August 19, 1895, by J. Fudloff and described and bounded as follows:-

Beginning at the place of discovery on Grizzly Creek, upper North Fork Toutle valley, about 500 feet above the first William Lode discovery and East of Grizzly gulch, at the same discovery stake with the Mt Adams Primus Discovery: and running thence 300 feet South 45° West: thence 1500 feet North 45° West: thence 600 feet North 45° East: thence 1500 feet South 45° East: and thence 300 feet to the place
