

Discovered and located June 28, 1895, by F. Ludloff, and described and bounded as follows:

Beginning at the place of discovery, being a Cedar tree on the west bank of Lake Canyon Creek, below a cascade, and running thence 300 feet North 75° East; thence 1500 feet North 15° West; thence 600 feet South 75° West; thence 1000 feet South 15° East; and thence 300 feet to the place of beginning.

Notice of location of this claim was filed and recorded in said Auditor's office in Vol. 4 of Mining Records, on page 223.

49. Northwest-Discovery Claim of the Black Rock Lode, in Skamania County, Washington, discovered and located June 27, 1895, by A. Mould, and described and bounded as follows: Beginning at the place of discovery on Empire Creek, North Toutle Valley, about 400 feet higher than the Higgly Lode claims, where the creek makes a sharp bend to the west, beside a black rock in the creek bed, and running thence 300 feet North 80° West; thence 1500 feet North 10° East; thence 600 feet South 80° East; thence 1500 feet South 10° West; and thence 300 feet North 80° West to the place of beginning. Notice of location of this claim was filed and recorded in said Auditor's office in Vol. 4 of Mining Records, on Page 68, July 9th, 1895.

50. The Southwest-Discovery Claim of the Black Rock Lode, in Skamania County, State of Washington, discovered and located June 27, 1895, by F. Ludloff, and described and bounded as follows:

Beginning at the same place of discovery as the claim last above described, and running thence 300 feet North 80° West; thence 1500 feet South 10° West; thence 600 feet South 80° East; thence 1500 feet North 10° East; and thence 300 feet North 80° West to the place of beginning. Notice of location of this claim was filed and recorded in said Auditor's
