57. The Southeast-Discovery Claim of the Altamonte Testia Lode in Skamania County, State of Washington, discovered and located August 19, 1895 by H. Wold, and described and bounded as follows: Beginning at the same place of discovery as the claim last above described, and running thence 300 feet South 60° West; thence 1500 feet South 30° East; thence 600 ^{feet} North 60° East; thence 1000 feet North 30° West; and thence 300 feet to the place of beginning. Notice of location of this claim was filed and recorded in said Auditor's office December 31, 1895 in Vol. 4 of Mining Records, at Page 247.

58. The Northwest-Discovery Claim of the Metropolitan Lode in Skamania County, State of Washington, discovered and located May 17, 1895 by Paul S. Reinck, and described and bounded as follows: Beginning at the place of discovery on Grizzly creek North Fork valley about 100 feet North from the North boundary line of the Grizzly lode claims, and running thence 300 feet North 5° East; thence 1500 feet North 85° West; thence 600 feet South 5° West; thence 1500 feet South 85° East; and thence 300 feet North 5° East to the place of beginning. Notice of location of this claim was filed and recorded in said Auditor's office in Vol 4 of Mining Records, at Page 81, on July 9, 1895.

59. The Southeast-Discovery Claim of the Metropolitan Lode in Skamania County, State of Washington
