61. The Southeast Discovering Claim of the La Brosse Lode, in Skamania County, State of Washington, discovered and located August 10, 1895 by A. Gold and described and bounded as follows: Beginning at the same place of discovery as the claim last above described, and running thence 300 feet South 70° West; thence 1500 feet South 20° East; thence 600 feet North 70° East; thence 1500 feet North 20° West, and thence 300 feet to the place of beginning. Notice of location of this claim was filed and recorded in said Auditor's office Dec. 31, 1895, in Vol. 4 of Mining Records, on page 248.
