

62. The Northeast-Discovery Claim of the Silver Lake Lode in Skamania County, State of Washington, discovered and located August 10, 1895 by A. Wood, and described and bounded as follows:-

Beginning at the place of discovery on Quetzal Creek, about one thousand feet above the forks, and running thence 300 feet North 42° West; thence 1500 feet North 40° East; thence 600 feet South 42° East; thence 1500 feet South 40° West; and thence 300 feet to the place of beginning. Notice of location of this claim was filed and recorded in said Auditor's office December 31, 1895 in Vol 4 of Mining Records, on Page 249,

63. The Southwest-Discovery Claim of the Silver Lake Lode, in Skamania County, State of Washington, discovered and located August 10, 1895 by J. Ludloff, and described and bounded as follows:-

Beginning at the same place of discovery as the claim last above described, and running thence 300 feet North 42° West; thence 1500 feet South 48° West; thence 600 feet South 42° East; thence 1500 feet North 48° East; and thence 300 feet to the place of beginning. Notice of location of this claim was filed and recorded in said Auditor's office December 31, 1895 in Volume 4 of Mining Records on page 225.

64. The Northwest-Discovery Claim of the Hudson Lode, in Skamania County, State of Washington, discovered and located August 10, 1895, by J. Ludloff and described and bounded as follows:

Beginning at the place of discovery about 200 feet up Quetzal Creek above the forks; and running thence 300 feet South 65° West; thence 1500 feet North 25° West; thence 600 feet North 65° East; thence 1500 feet South 25° East; and thence 300 feet to the place of beginning. Notice of location of this claim was filed and recorded in said Auditor's office
