70. The Northwest-Discovery Claim of the Bonanza Lode in Skamania County, State of Washington, discovered and located Aug. 16, 1895, by J. Lindloff, and described and bounded as follows:

Beginning at the place of discovery on the West-end line of Queen of the Lake lode on top of divide between Quartz creek and Queen of Lake creek, and running thence 500 feet South 20° West; thence 1500 feet North 70° West; thence 600 feet North 20° East; thence 1000 feet South 70° East, and thence 500 feet to the place of beginning.
