71. The Northwest Discovery Claim of the Green Bay Lode, in Skamania County, Washington, discovered and located August 17, 1895 by J. Ludloff, and described and bounded as follows:-

Beginning at the same place of discovery as the claim last above described; and running thence 300 feet South 25° West; thence 1500 feet South 65° East; thence 600 feet North 25° East; thence 1500 feet North 65° West, and thence 300 feet to the place of beginning. Notice of location of this claim was filed and recorded in said Auditor's office Dec. 31st 1895, in Vol. 4 of Mining Records on Page 251.

73. The Northwest Discovery Claim of the Agnes Lode in Skamania County, State of Washington, discovered and located August 18, 1895 by A. Auld, and described and bounded as follows: Beginning at the place of discovery about 200 feet from the divide of the Cold Water range, North Slope, North of Union Basin; and running thence 300 feet South 65° West; thence 1500 feet North 25° West; thence 600 feet North 65° East; thence 1500 feet South 25° East; and thence
