Beginning at the same place of discovery as the claim last above described and running thence 300 feet South 45° West; thence 1500 feet South 45° East; thence 600 feet North 45° East; thence 1500 feet North 45° West; and thence 300 feet to the place of beginning. 81. The Northwest Discovery Claim of the Annapes Lode in Skamania County, State of Washington, discovered and located August 19, 1895 by R. Ludloff and described and bounded as follows:-

Beginning at the place of discovery about 250 feet above the Annapes Lode discovery on Slate Creek, running thence 300 feet South 45° West; thence 1500 feet North 45° West; thence 600 feet North 45° East; thence 1500 feet South 45° East; and thence 300 feet to the place of beginning.
