Rudloff and described and bounded as follows: - Beginning at the place of discovery on the Eastern slope of the first gulch on West bank of St. Helens Lake from inlet about 300 feet higher in the gulch than the Queen of the Lake lode; beside a cascade, and running thence 300 feet North 10° East; thence 1500 feet North 80° West; thence 600 feet South 10° West thence 1500 feet South 80° East; and thence 300 feet to the place of beginning. Notice of location of this claim was filed and recorded in said auditors office July 9, 1895 in Volume 4 of Mining Records on Page 69.

145. The Northwest Discovery claim of the Sweden lode in Skamania County, State of Washington, discovered and located June 28, 1895 by A. Mold and described and bounded as follows; Beginning at the place of discovery under a cedar tree bearing the notice of location on eastern bank of creek below a cascade, about one mile South of the Norway lode discovery, and running thence 300 feet North 76° East; thence 1500 feet North 14° West
