That the said contract has been faithfully performed by claimants and claimants have sold and delivered to A. L. Houghtaling 994,224 feet of yellow fir logs and 1,257,391 feet red fir logs, for which there became due and payable to claimants the sum of \$3,874.53 for stumpage.
