

Homestead Declaration

I, James Haffey, of Stevens, Skamania County, Washington do hereby state that I am the head of a family and am a resident of Skamania County, Washington and at the date hereof Sheriff of said Skamania County. That I have U. S. Patent to the land hereinafter described for a homestead and have heretofore resided thereon and intend hereafter to reside thereon and claim the same as a homestead. That the said land is described as follows; north $\frac{1}{2}$ of north-west $\frac{1}{4}$, and the north $\frac{1}{2}$ of the north-east $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 5, in Township 1 north range 5 east, W. M. in Skamania County, State of Washington. That I estimate the value of said land to not exceed the sum of \$1000.00. One-Thousand-Dollars. That I hereby select the same as my homestead and hereby claim same as such.

Notice is hereby given that I, the undersigned, claim the water now running, flowing or being in a small spring to the extent of one cubic foot per second of time. Said spring is situated on or near the middle of the dividing line between the S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ and the S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 16 Tps. 3. N. R. 10 E. W. M. The water so claimed is for irrigating and domestic purposes. The point of diversion is at the location of the spring. The means of diversion is by flume ditch or pipe, which said flume or ditch will run in an easterly direction by best possible route. Dated this 19th day of May 1905.
