

## Notice of Water Location

Know all men by these presents: That the undersigned, by virtue of the rights given him by the Statute and Mining laws of the State of Washington, do hereby claim the water of this stream, known as Troutle River, which flows westerly to this point of diversion from Spirit Lake, and thence westerly from such point. The point of diversion is near as I can describe it is 150 feet east of the County line between Okanogan County and Lincoln County and on the Troutle River, within a Government Reserve and about four and one half miles west of north of Mt St. Helens. It is intended to divert said water by means of flumes placing in the stream a diverting dam of suitable proportion. The amount of water claimed hereby is to the extent of 30000 cubic feet per second of time. The purpose of this claim is to divert the water of Troutle River as above described and convey same by means of a pipe or flume from the point of diversion to a point 500 feet easterly from the West line of section two Township nine, Range Three East and within 2000 feet of Troutle River.
