Water Notice

Aug. 7, 1905

The undersigned parties give notice hereby that it is their intention to use and they do hereby claim the water, lying, being or flowing in Little Owl Creek at or near the point of joining this stream at the fork of the creek in N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 4, to the extent of five (5) cubic feet per second of time. Said water to be used for irrigating purposes or as near Sec. 15 T. 3 N. D. 10 E. (Skamania Co. Wd.) also for flushing and power purposes over the said section. It is intended to divert said water by means of a ditch or flume extending from point of diversion to place of use on such a line as the character of the ground will permit:

Notice Water Location

Know all men by these Presents That the undersigned by virtue of the rights given him by the mining laws and Statute of the State of Washington does hereby claim the water of this stream known as Turtle River and having its source in Spirit-Lake (Sometimes called Mt. St. Helens Lake) The water hereby claimed flows about due north into Boundary County and are located in a Government reserve in Skamania County, State of Washington. The amount of water claimed hereby is in amount of about 2,000 cubic feet per second of time. The purpose of this claim is to divert the water as above described into a flume or pipe and convey said water through a portion of said reserve to some point within 500 feet of the County line between Boundary and Skamania Counties and within Skamania County about 2,500 feet from Turtle River and use same at this point for mining, milling or manufacturing purposes by electricity or otherwise. It is intended to divert the above described water by placing in the stream at point of diversion a concrete box of suitable proportion to conduct said water into pipe or flume. The exact place as near as the undersigned can determine is 1000 feet from the actual outlet about 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles slightly east of Mt. St. Helens.
