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Notice to Herby Liver, that on the 5th day of December, 1905 an action was commenced in the Superior Court of the State of Washington for the County of Klamath, by filing of a complaint in said court on such date, in which wherein the Columbia Valley Railroad Co., a corporation, was and is plaintiff and W.J. Green and Rose Green, his wife and the Columbia River Navigation Company, a corporation, are defendants, the object of said action being to compel said defendants by decree of court to specifically perform a certain written contract made and entered into on the 10th day of August, 1879 by W.J. Green and Rose Green his wife as the owners of the real estate therein described, and the plaintiff herein, by the terms and conditions of which, the said W.J. Green and Rose Green, his wife, promised and agreed for a valuable consideration to convey to plaintiff upon demand a strip of land 100 feet wide, to be used as a right of way upon which plaintiff was to build a railroad, the same being 50 feet on each side of the center line of said railroad as the same was surveyed and located over, through and upon Lot 1 in Section 32, and the South-West  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the South-West  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 29 in Town 3 North, Range 8 East of the W.M.R.

Green and Rose Green, his wife, as the present owners of said property, that said contract was duly recorded in the office of the County Auditor of Klamath County, Washington on the 24th day of October 1879 and that defendant, the Columbia River Navigation Company's interest in said above described premises was acquired subsequent to the making and recording of said property; that whatever interest said defendant took in said property it took subject to the rights of the plaintiff under the terms and conditions of said contract.

That a decree of the court is asked requiring said defendants, W.J.
