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Notice of Waterright.

State of Washington

County of Klamath } ss. Do all whom these Presents may concern:

Be it Known That I, the undersigned, Resident of Home Valley in said County and State do hereby publish and declare, as a legal notice to all the world I. That I want to have a legal right to use the use, possession and control of and claim 1000 (one thousand) inches of the Waters of the Stream, known as Little Wind River, in said County and State for irrigating and other purposes. II. That the special use purpose for which said water is intended to be used and the place of intended use is situated at or near a point in the Northwest quarter of Sec. 14. Township 3 Range 8 E. W. M. to be used for domestic, (irrigating) and other industrial purposes, Saw mill etc. III. That I will take said water out of and divert it from said Stream by means of Dams and Ditch or flume, which said ditch or flume is 36 inches by 72 inches in size and carries or conveys 1000 inches of water from said Dam or diversion; said Ditch or flume takes and directs the water off from said Stream at a point upon its easterly bank in Sec. 14. T. 3 R. 8 E. W. M., thence running or to run, to and upon said described land and through said land if.... so desire to any requisite point of final discharge. IV. That I appropriated and took said water on the 30th day of Dec. A. D. 1905 by means of said this notice in suit in due time fulfill the requirements governing Water rights. V. That the name of the appropriator of said water B. E. Larson, residence Home Valley, Klamath Co. Washington VI. That I also hereby claim said water and the right of way therefor, and for said water by it conveyed, or to be conveyed, from said point of appropriation to said land or point of final discharge, and also the right of location upon any lands of any Dams, flumes, reservoirs, constructed or to be constructed by me in appropriating and in using said water. VII. That I also claim the right to keep in repair and to enlarge said means of water appropriation at any time and the right to dispose of the said right, water, ditch, or said appurtenances, in part or whole, at any time. Claiming the same, all and singular, Under any and all laws National and State, and the regulations and decisions thereunder in the exercise of water rights.

Together with all and singular the hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging or appertaining, or to come to the same.
