

W. L. Smith to A. H. Stadman

Plus Indenture, Made this tenth day of June 1893 by and between W. L. Smith single party of the first part, and A. H. Stadman party of the second part, Intersith, That whereas, the party of the second part, has loaned to the party of the first part the full ~~sum~~ of Two Hundred and eighty (\$280.00) Dollars, which sum of the said party of the first part agree to pay sixty days after this date, and to pay interest thereon at maturity at the rate of eight percent per annum from this date until paid; and also to pay all taxes and assessments which may be assessed or levied to or against the party of the second part, or assigns, on account of such loan. All according to the terms of a certain promissory note given therefor, of which the following is a copy:

\$280 Portland, On June 10th 1893
Sixty days after date without grace we promise to pay to the order of A. H. Stadman Two Hundred and Eighty Dollars for value received with interest after maturity at the rate of 10 percent per annum until paid. Principal and interest payable in U. S. Gold Coin at Merchants National Bank, Portland. One or in case a suit or action is instituted to collect this note or any portion thereof—promise to pay such additional sum as the court may adjudge reasonable as attorney's fees in said suit or action.
