In the Matter of the estate of Michael Gundel, deceased.

County of Multnomah, ss. I, C.W. Herrall of lawful age and a competent witness, being first duly sworn, testify as follows: I reside in the city of Portland County of Multnomah, State of Oregon. I knew Michael Gundel in his life time and at the time of witnessing his will hereinafter mentioned; he was a resident of the city of Portland, Oregon at the time of his death, he died on the 27th day of February 1905; he has left estate in the County of Multnomah State of Oregon. The instrument now shown to me marked as filed in this Court on the 29th day of March 1905 purporting to be the last will and testament of Michael Gundel deceased was signed by the said Michael Gundel deceased, in the city of Portland Oregon on the - ---- day of December 1904, the day it bears date, in the presence of myself and of V.K. Strode and P. Maher the other subscribing witnesses with whom I was acquainted at the time of witnessing said will; and the said Michael Gundel thereupon published the said instrument, and declared the same to be his last will and testament and requested us in attestation thereof to sign the same as witnesses. The said V.K. Strode and P. Maher and I, then and there, in the presence of Michael Gundel, deceased and in the presence of each other subscribed our names as witnesses to the said instrument. At the time of executing the said instrument the said Michael Gundel deceased was over the age of twenty one years to wit, of the age of 56 years or thereabouts and was of sound and disposing mind and not under any restraint, undue influence or fraudulent misrepresentations.

In the Matter of the estate of Michael Gundel, deceased.

Now at this time Comes John Gundel and petitions to Court to admit to probate a certain instrument purporting to be the Last Will and Testament of the above named Michael Gundel deceased, and that petitioner, John Gundel be appointed executor and that Letters of Testamentary be issued to John Gundel and it appearing to the Court that said decedent Michael Gundel died on or about the 27th day of February 1905 in the County of Multnomah State of Oregon and that at the time of his death was a resident of the County of Multnomah State of Oregon. That said deceased left an estate in the County of Multnomah and State of Oregon consisting of personal property of the probable value of two thousand dollars: That the next kin and heirs at law of said deceased are as follows to-wit:

John Gundel (petitioner) age 58 years, Portland, Oregon, George Gundel also aged 58 years both brothers of the deceased and residing at Portland, Oregon, and Anna Dickerson aged

about 50 years and Dona Detmer aged about 48 years of age, both sisters of deceased and residing at Hancver, Wisconsin. And it further appearing from the testimony of G.W. Herrall and Strode that said deceased on the 21st day of December 1904 in their presence executed the will now propounded for probate, and it appearing to the court that said instrument is the last will and testament of said deceased and that it was executed in all particulars according to law; that said decedent at the time he executed said will as aforesaid was upward of 56 years of age and he was at that time of sound mind and not laboring under any restraint or undue influence and that in said will said John Gundel was named Executor thereof. Therefore it is ordered that said document heretofore filed, purporting to be the last will and testament of said Michael Gundel, deceased, be admitted to Probate as the Last will and Testament of said deceased, and that John Gundel be and he is hereby appointed executor thereof and that Letters Testamentary issue to said John Gundel upon him taking and filing the oath required by law, the said will providing that he be not required to give bonds as executor.
