

## Constitution and by Laws of the

## Little white salmon Good Roads Association

## Preamble

Whereas in view of the conditions of the Little White Salmon Valley Roads and whereas an organization will benefit the public, the tax payers and investors and Whereas we should cultivate and acquaintance with our fellows in order that we may be the better enable to form an undivided opposition to acts pertaining to our roads,

Therefore we, the resident tax payers and qualified electors and homesteaders of the Little white Salmon Valley Road District No. 8 of Skamania County Washington have resolved to join this association which is known as the Little white Salmon Good Roads Association District No. 8 Skamania county Washington for the purpose of promotion and protection of our common interests and have adopted the annexed constitution and by-laws for its guidance, for united we possess strength, let us then act justly and fear not.

## Constitution

## Article 1

Section I This Association shall be known as the Little white salmon Good Roads Association of District No. 8 of Skamania county Washington. Section II. This organization cannot be dissolved so long as five members in good standing object thereto. Section III The Object of this association shall be the practice of those virtues that elevate and adorn society and remind man of his duty to his fellowmen. The elevation and promotion of every matter pertaining to good roads of the Little White Salmon Valley Road District No. 8 Skamania Co. Wash. Section IV All Candidates for membership of this association shall be resident tax payers or homesteaders and qualified electors of Road District No. 8 Skamania county Wash. and may become members by paying an initiation fee of 25 cents to the treasurer of the Association. Section V All candidates for membership may be proposed by one member and seconded by another who can speak knowingly as to his qualifications and he shall be elected by acclamation. Section VI This constitution and by laws shall not be altered or amended except at regular meetings of the association and with the concurrence of two thirds of the members present.

Approved this tenth day of January 1911

## By-Laws

## Article 1

Meetings: Section 1, The regular meetings of this association shall be on the third Saturday of each month at 2.30 P.M. in the school house of School District No. 24 Mill A of Skamania county Washington. Section 2 Five Members shall constitute a quorum including the secretary and the presiding chairman. Section III. The officers of the association shall consist of a chairman and a secretary and two vice chairman. The secretary shall also act as treasurer. Section IV

It shall be the duty of the chairman to preside at all meetings of the association, preserve order enforce the constitution and by laws and watch vigilantly over the affairs of the association. He shall have the power at the election of officers and when the members are equally divided he shall have the deciding vote on any question. He shall decide all questions subject to an appeal to the association. He shall have the power to call meetings whenever he deems it necessary or when desired to designate the place of meetings. Section V The duty of the secretary and treasurer shall be to keep accurate records of the minutes of the meetings and at all time have his books open for inspection by members. He shall receive all initiation fees and assessments and he shall keep in trust all money collected by him until he

be instructed by the association for its expenditure. Section VI The election of officers shall be by ballot and shall be held at the first meeting in January of each year and the terms of office shall be for one year. Officers elected to office this 10th day of January 1911 shall hold office until the first meeting in January 1912 or until his successor qualifies. It shall require a majority vote to elect officers. Proxy votes shall be considered legal in the election of officers and such other matters as shall come before the association, providing they meet the requirements of section 4 of the constitution. Section VII Any person is eligible for membership in this organization providing they meet the requirements of section 4 of the Constitution. Section VIII. Initiation fees must be paid within ten days from the time the candidate becomes a member.
