

Andy Olson to Portland and Northwestern exploration and mining company

This indenture made this 5th day of April, 1897, between Andy Olson, of the County of Lewis, and State of Washington, party of the first part, and the Portland and Northwestern exploration and mining company, a corporation incorporated under the laws of the State of Oregon party of the second part

Witnesseth: That the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar (\$1.00) to him in hand paid by the said party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath remised, released, and quit claimed, and by these presents does remise, release and quit claim unto the said party of the second part, its successors and assigns: All the following described real estate, situated in the St. Helens and Bishop Mining district, County of Skamania, and State of Washington to wit:

Good hope lode, second discovery claim north 45 degrees West M. 1000 feet linear and 300 feet linear on each side, side boundary lines parallel to center line. Locality, north Skamania county, center of bed of north fork of Lewis River, about 400 yards above the mouth of Jumbo creek, discovered and located May 27th, 1896, and recorded in Skamania County records December 1896, in book "C" of miscellaneous records

Also, Morning Sun lode, second discovery claim, north 45 degrees West M. 1500 feet linear and 300 feet linear on each side, side boundary lines parallel to center line. Locality North Skamania county center of bed of north fork of Lewis River, about a quarter of a mile below mouth of Jumbo creek, discovered and located May 27 1896, and recorded in Skamania county records December 6th 1896, in book "C", page 216 of miscellaneous records. Also California lode,

second discovery claim, north 45 degrees. West M. 1500 linear feet and 300 feet linear on each side, side boundary lines parallel to center line. Locality, north Skamania county, center of bed of north fork of Lewis river, about a quarter of a mile west of mouth of Ghost lake creek on a cascade of about 25 feet, discovered and located May 27th, 1897, and recorded in skamania county records in book "C", at page 217 of miscellaneous records on December 6, 1896.

Together with all and singular the lodes and veins within the lines of said claims, and the dips, spurs, mines, minerals, easements, mining fixtures, improvements, rights, privileges and appurtenances thereunto in any wise belonging.

To have and to hold the lands tenements and hereditaments hereby conveyed unto the said party of the second part, its successors and assigns forever.
