

Affidavit of John W. Stevenson

State of Washington

County of Skamania, ss. I, John W. Stevenson of Cape Horn, in said County and State being first duly sworn on oath say that I am a son of John W. Stevenson deceased, formerly of said County who entered as a Homestead the south half of the southwest quarter of section 33 township 2 North and the north half of the northwest quarter of section 4 township 1 north of Range 5 East of the Willamette Meridian in said County under patent number-----, dated December 22nd 1865 and recorded in the office of the Auditor of said County on March 15th 1909 in Book L at page 359, that I knew in his life time George J. Stevenson named in the various documents of the foregoing abstract and that he is the same person therein as G.G. Stevenson J.G. Stevenson and G.J. Stevenson in said instruments, that the person mentioned by him in his last will as his mother is the same persons named as Sarah Stevenson in the deed of Sarah Stevenson to William Haffey and James Nevin in No. 6 of said abstract; that said John W. Stevenson, George J. Stevenson Sarah Stevenson, William Haffey and James Nevins are long since deceased.

State of Washington

County of Skamania, ss. I, the undersigned being first duly sworn depose and say as follows: I have known one J.W. Britain for many years and especially when he lived on his homestead as described on the patent from the United States, recorded on page 297 in Book A of Patents, records of Skamania Co. Wash. and therefore know that said J.W. Britain is identically the same person as Jacob W. Britain to whom said patent was issued. I also knew that said J.W. Britin was married and afterwards was divorced from his wife, she obtaining said divorce in the superior Court for State of Washington for Pierce County, a copy of the decree of said divorce being now of record on page 128 in Book F of Miscellaneous records of said Skamania County Wash.; and I know that said J.W. Britain as mentioned in said decree of divorce is identically the same persons as Jacob W. Britain to whom the above mentioned patent for homestead was issued. I also say that I am the Co. Auditor for above County and State and as such the custodian of all the records of said County appertaining to the transfer of real estate matters in connection with same and that said J.W. Britain or Jacob W. Britain is the only person and identically the same person to whom the land described in said patent was assessed and that his name is sometimes spelled J.W. Britain and sometimes Jacob W.
