I claim the water for domestic and irrigation purposes and I intend to use it at the South $\frac{1}{2}$ of Southwest $\frac{1}{4}$ of the Northwest $\frac{1}{4}$ of section 14 Township three North of Range 9 East of Willamette meridian. I intend to divert the water by ditch at a point 300 ft west and 250 feet north of Southwest corner of the above described land.

Sixteen days after date for value received in work, I promise to pay to the order of R. I. Sanderson eighty dollars with interest thereon payable from June 15th 1909 at the rate of 12 per cent per annum from date, and if not so paid the whole sum of both principal and interest to become immediately due and collectible at the option of the holder of this note. If the interest is not paid when due it shall be compounded with the principal and bear like interest therewith, principal and interest payable in lawful money of the United States. And in case suit is instituted to collect this note or any portion thereof I promise to pay such additional sum as the Court may adjudge reasonable as attorneys fees to be taxed as part of the costs of such suit for the use of plaintiffs attorney. It is specially agreed and consented that a deficiency judgment may be taken in a suit upon this note. I also release said R. I. Sanderson from all liability for other work on the survey for which this note is given in payment for his service.
