

From John A. Henkle et ux to Mary F. Harley.

This In Shortum Wituseth. That John A. Henkle  
and his wife Mary E. Henkle parties of the first  
part for and in consideration of the sum of One  
hundred and fifty Dollars to them in hand paid  
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have  
been and sold and conveyed and by these pres-  
ents do bargain sell and convey unto Mary F. Harley  
party of the second part the following described premises,  
to wit:

The northeast quarter <sup>(1/4)</sup> of Section nineteen  
(19) in Township three (3) North of Range ten (10) East  
Willamette Mission & Common Land of State of  
Washington containing (160) acres more or less.

In addition with the premises fore mentioned and appurte-  
nances unto the said Mary F. Harley her heirs and  
assigns forever.

This Conveyance is intended as a mortgage  
to secure the payment of the sum of One hundred  
and fifty and ~~one~~ <sup>one</sup> hundred and ~~one~~ <sup>one</sup> hundred and ~~one~~ <sup>one</sup> hundred and  
fifty dollars in one or more of the following  
form of a certain instrument of writing of which the  
following is a copy, to wit:

Portland Oregon Oct 27.. 1898

Two years after date without grace we promise  
to pay to the Order of Mary F. Harley at Portland  
Oregon Three hundred and fifty and ~~one~~ <sup>no</sup> ~~one~~ <sup>one</sup> hundred and ~~one~~ <sup>one</sup> hundred and ~~one~~ <sup>one</sup> hundred and  
fifty dollars in gold Coin of the United States of America, of the  
present Standard and weight, with interest thereon in  
like gold Coin at the rate of Eight (8) per cent per  
annum from date until paid for balance received.

Interest to be paid annually, and if not so  
paid the whole sum of both principal and interest  
to become immediately due and collectible at the  
option of the holder of this note. And in case  
suit or action is instituted to collect this note  
or any portion thereof we promise and agree to pay  
in addition to the costs and disbursements provided  
by statute such additional sum in like Gold Coin  
as the Court may adjudge reasonable for Attorneys  
fees to be allowed in said suit or action.
