

From James G. Harris (Shriff) to Bartholomew Burnett,

This Indenture, Made this 25th day of July A. D., one thousand eight hundred and ninety eight by and between James G. Harris Sheriff of Skamania County, State of Washington the party of the first part and Bartholomew Burnett of the County of Skamania and State of Washington the party of the second part. It testifies, that whereas by virtue of an order of sale issued out of the Superior Court of the State of Washington in and for Skamania County, holding terms at Sturmon tested on the 25th day of May A. D., 1897. upon a judgment rendered in said Court on the 21st day of May, A. D., 1897. in favor of Bartholomew Burnett Plaintiff and against Thomas H. Smith, M. G. Smith, Annie L. Larkin Adeline Smith, Angelina Smith Mary A. Smith, George Carr and C. Peters and Frank Larkin Defendants and to James G. Harris the then acting Sheriff of Skamania County State of Washington directed and delivered, commanding him that he should sell the premises hereinafter described in the manner prescribed by law; and whereas the said James G. Harris Sheriff as aforesaid did on the 28th day of June A. D., 1897 sell the hereinafter described real estate at public auction at the Court House door in Sturmon, Skamania County, State of Washington, after having first given due notice of the time and place of said sale by advertising according to law; and whereas at said sale Bartholomew Burnett became the purchaser of the real estate hereinafter described, for the sum of one thousand seven hundred and fifty-six and $\frac{35}{100}$ dollars (\$1756.35) by reason of his being the highest and best bidder therefor at said sale. And whereas said sale has been in all things confirmed by the said Superior Court and the time for redemption having now fully expired and no application having been made to redeem the hereinafter described premises
