

100 yards below the Triple Fall also at a fall on Blue Bird Creek, there commencing at ledge and running 300 ft. in a North Easterly direction to corner stake. Hence 1000 ft. in a South Easterly direction to corner stake. Hence 300 ft. in a South Westerly direction to corner stake. Hence 300 ft. in the same direction to corner stake. Hence 1500 ft. in a North Westerly direction to corner stake. Hence 300 ft. in a North Easterly direction to place of beginning.

3rd An undivided one quarter interest in the Quartz Ledge or ledge known as the Gray Eagle and described as follows, to wit: On the South side of Blue Bird Creek about one half miles from main Hatchet River and about 300 yards up said Creek above mouth of creek intersecting said Blue Bird Creek on North Side and about $\frac{1}{3}$ mile below first falls on said Blue Bird Creek, said claim to be 1500 ft. from this point in a South Easterly direction and 300 ft. East and West from center of ledge.

4th an undivided one quarter interest in the Blue Bird quartz Mining claim situated and described as follows: - About 150 yards from the head of Blue Bird Creek, a tributary of main Hatchet River, and east of Ball Mt., about one mile and in the head of said Blue Bird Creek east and at the foot of Huckleberry Butte next to Triple Falls of said Creek 1500 ft. along head in a South Easterly direction from location point and 300 ft. South East and 300 ft. North East from center of this ledge and point.

All other mining claims being held by said parties of the first part, situated as above described in Skamania County, State of Washington together with an undivided one quarter of all dross, spurs and angles, and also one quarter of the metals, one gold, and silver bearing quartz rock and earth, others, and all the rights, privileges and franchises thereto incident, appendant and appertaining, or therewith usually had and enjoyed; and also, all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances therunto belonging or in anywise appertaining.
