

assigns, to include in the judgment that may be recovered, (in addition to the costs provided by law) counsel fees and charges of attorneys and counsel employed in such foreclosure suit, the sum of fifty $\frac{00}{100}$ Dollars in Gold Coin (or in case of settlement or payment being made after suit has been commenced, and before the final decree has been entered thereon, an attorney's fee of twenty five $\frac{00}{100}$ Dollars in Gold Coin shall be taxed as a part of the costs in such suit), as well as all payments that the said party of the second part his heirs, executors, administrators or assigns may be obliged to make for his or their security by insurance or on account of any taxes, charges, incumbrances or assessments whatsoever on the said premises or any part thereof.




