POWER OF ATTORNEY.

NOTICE OF THE APPROPRIATION OF THE WATER FROM  
THIS STREAM.

This is to certify that STANTON C. LAPHAM, of Portland, Oregon, claims the water lying being or flowing in this stream known as Dry Creek to the extent of 4 cubic feet of water per second of time.

The water so claimed is to be used for domestic purposes and irrigation in and upon the North one half of the southwest quarter and the south one half of the north west quarter of Section 36, Town. 4 North of Range 9 East .W.M.

The water is to be diverted at or near this point being about 200 feet north of the present intake of my pipe line and about 600 feet north of the line of my premises.
