PROCEEDINGS

Be it remembered, That on the 15th day of October, 1915, D.G. Jackson Company by his attorney Kienstra and Shields filed a complaint and notice that Mrs. M.A. Sullivan was owing the plaintiff \$21.90 and asked for judgement against the defendant in the sum of \$21.90 and costs of suit.

Notice was issued to appear Nov. 1st 1915, to answer foregoing complaint.

Now on the 29th day of October, 1915, Royal J. Taylor, a citizen of the United States and resident of Skamania County, State of Washington and legally entitled to serve papers filed his return showing due and legal services upon Mrs. M.A. Sullivan, defendant personally on the 29th day of October, 1915.

Now the court finds that due and legal services has been had upon the defendant in the said County on this 1st day of November at 10 oclock A.M. the time set for hearing, the court having waited for the period of one hour from 10 oclock A.M. for the appearance of the defendant, and the defendant failed to appear either in person or by attorney, and the defendant is hereby ordered and declared to be in default.

It is here now ordered, adjudged and decreed that the plaintiff do have and recover of and from the defendant Mrs. M.A. Sullivan the sum of \$21.90 Twenty one and 90/100 dollars with costs of suit taxed in the sum of \$2.00, A total of (\$23.90) Twenty three and 90/100 dollars.
