STATE OF WASH. TO SHEPLER.

WATER RIGHT NOTICE.

NOTICE is hereby given that I the undersigned, have this day May the 6th 1916, filed a water right on this creek, which heads on the west slope of Borthwick mountain and empties into the Little White Salmon River and I hereby claim for domestic and irrigation purposes 2.1 (two and one tenth) cubic feet of water per minute. The Head works will consist of a ditch 60 feet in length, extending from this notice in an easterly direction to the extreme east fork of this stream, the location of this notice marking the western terminus of the ditch. Pipes will connect this ditch with a tank from which the quantity of water claimed will be pumped through a 1 1/4" (one and a quarter inch) delivery pipe. The 1/4 corner of sections 7 and 18, T 3 N.R. 10 E. W.M. bears south 4 deg. 37' East 3935.80 ft. distant from this notice.
