I, HENRY SELMAN WELLER, of lawful age, being first duly sworn, on oath, say; that I am a member of the law firm of Gillen & Weller, having an office in the Savings Bank Building, Jamaica, City, County and State of New York; that I have had exclusive control of all matters connected with the estate of Sarah A. Cox, deceased, and Eliza J. Leverich, deceased, on behalf of Daisy Leverich, of the City, County and State of New York, who is the administratrix with the Will annexed of Sarah A. Cox, deceased, and the executrix of Eliza J. Leverich deceased; that I personally had known the said Sarah A. Cox and the said Eliza J. Leverich, for many years prior to their death; that the said Sarah A. Cox and Eliza J. Leverich were sisters, and the said Daisy Leverich was their niece and resided with said Sarah A. Cox until her death and subsequently thereto resided with said Elizabeth J. Leverich until her death.

That Sarah A. Cox resided at Garden City, in the County of Nassau and State of New York, where she died, leaving a Last Will and Testament which was duly admitted to probate by the Surrogate of said County; that said Will appointed as Executor Samuel Cox the husband of said Sarah A. Cox, who duly qualified as such Executor; that I was personally acquainted with the said Samuel Cox and know of my own knowledge that he died on the 20th day of July 1903; that after his death I personally conducted such proceedings in said Surrogate's court which resulted in the appointment by said Surrogate on the 31st day of July, 1903, of the said Daisy Leverich, as administratrix with the Will of said Sarah A. NELSON TO SPOKANE, PORTLAND AND SEATTLE RY. CO.

CONTRACT OF RELEASE, Made this 4th day of October, 1916, between Eva V. NELSON and S.D. NELSON, her husband, of LaFayette, Oregon, and G.H. WATSON AND FANNIE E. WATSON his wife, and W.F. DARR, and Louisa M. DARR, his wife, first parties and SPOKANE, PORTLAND AND SEATTLE RAILWAY COMPANY, a corporation, hereinafter referred to as the "Railway Company" second party.

The railway Company in the construction of its line of railway through sections thirty five (35) ^{and} thirty six (36) township two (2) north of range six (6) east of the Willamette Meridian, Skamania County, Washington, changed the channel of the stream known as Woodward Creek first by diverting the waters of said creek along the northerly side of the railway right of way easterly to the connection with Little Creek and subsequently in 1909 again diverting the waters of said creek still farther to the north but still emptying into Little Creek, thus carrying the waters of both creeks through and under the right of way at the original location of said Little Creek in the northeast quarter of northeast quarter of section 35. The said Eva V. Nelson is the owner of land on each side of the railroad right of way in section 35, and the said Watson and Darr are the owners of land lying between the railway right of way and the Columbia River in sections
