

Amos Lensch to J. H. Hawley & F. Preske.

This Indenture, made the Thirteenth {13th} day of May in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and ninety Seven, between Amos Lensch of the County of _____ and _____ of _____ party of the first part, and J. H. Hawley and F. Preske of the County of Multnomah and State of Oregon parties of the second part, Witnesseth: that the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One {1⁰⁰} Dollars, lawful money of the United States of America, to him in hand paid by the said parties of the second part, the receipt whereof hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold, remised, released and forever quit-claimed, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell, remise release and forever quit-claim unto the said J. H. Hawley and F. Preske and to them their heirs and assigns all of that certain mineral claim, vein, lead or lode known and designated as the "Hope" mineral claim to said parties of the second part, and to their heirs and assigns. The "Hope" mineral lode is located, recorded and held by said party of the first part, situated in Copper Creek Mining District in Skamania County in the State of Washington and better known and described as follows-

Situated on a creek named "Little Creek" about Five miles above Canyon Creek, tributary to the East fork of Lewis River and said lode or vein being where a notice is posted on an elder tree and running thence Fifteen Hundred {1500} feet 20 degrees East of South, along said lode or vein, and claiming 200 feet East and 300 feet West thereof- Said "Hope" mineral claim is situated in the County of Skamania and State of Washington on the Public Domain Lands and is unswayed. - Town and section line are unknown. -

Said "Hope" claim was discovered April 11th 1897 and located April 12th 1897 by the said party of the first part.

This said claim { "Hope" } is bounded on the north by "The Yellow Boy" on the South by the "Center Star" on the East by the "Blance" mineral claims
